REVIEW:

OLD REVIEW: Open & Closed Syllable Patterns

SPELL: BE, LIP, NO, TAG

NEW REVIEW: /SH/ (Review, then read a few & spell a few.)

READ: SHED, WISH, SHOP, HUSH

SPELL: DASH, SHOT, SHIP, FISH

VISUAL DRILL: Use students deck and include the /sh/ phonogram card.

AUDITORY DRILL: Use students deck and include the /sh/ phonogram card.

BLENDING DRILL: Use students deck and include the /sh/ phonogram card.

INTRO NEW: /AY/ (Follow the 15 steps listed on the New Tutor Aid for phonemes & 9 steps for syllable types – use CLOVER)

READ: SAY, RAY, MAY, WAY, DAY, CLAY

SPELL: HAY, PAY, LAY, BAY, STAY, GLAY (Include nonsense words periodically to practice encoding and decoding skills. This minimizes the chance that the student knows a word from memory. Nonsense words will be used throughout this lesson plan package.)

SPELLING: Sentences for Dictation

- 1.) Ray had a gray day at the bay.
- 2.) The man has a tray with clay.

READING: *Will Ray Dash to the Subway?*

NON-PHONS (RED WORDS): THE, ONE, ONLY, ONCE, OF

*Remember, when student reads and spells these words correctly in 7-10 lessons, retire these red words and give 3-5 new words.
